# **HOURS**

- Our current hours of operation are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. Hours are subject to change.
- Though there are no time limits to the length of your visit today, the average visit lasts 1.5 hours. We kindly ask that you keep this in mind so that the garden can safely meet admission demand.

### **SERVICES**

- The gift shop is open and is accepting credit card payments only.
- The ConAgra Café is open from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. daily and is serving a limited menu. Seating for café patrons is available indoors. Guests are asked to not reconfigure the tables and chairs and to remove masks only when eating and drinking. Operation is subject to change.
- Indoor restrooms are open in the visitor and education center. Portable restrooms are available in the garden.
- Water fountains are not in service and wheelchairs are not available to reserve/loan at this time.

#### MAY I EXPLORE OUTSIDE?

Please do! Our outdoor gardens are open year-round for exploration and enjoyment. The Japanese park is temporarily closed for an exciting renovation. The model railroad garden will be open on the weekends in April and will be open daily from May-October.
